Gender norms around care, gender segregation in education and the labour market, and gender inequalities in pay remain pertinent.</p> <p>The Index allows Member States to easily monitor and compare gender equality progress across various groups of women and men in the EU over time and to understand where improvements are most needed. The 2022 Index has a thematic focus on care in the pandemic. It explores the division of informal childcare, long-term care and housework between women and men.</p> | EN |
